We can accommodate up to six babies or children at any one time. Our facilities are available for the whole family if needed. The main aim is to provide specialist nursing care for each child whilst simultaneously providing much needed respite for parents and carers.

A referral to Zoe's Place can be made by a family member or a health care professional involved in the care of the child.

Philosophy of care

We are a registered charity and our care is completely free of charge to all families using our services - all thanks to your donations!

Activities and therapies

At Zoe's Place, we focus on engaging children in a spectrum of stimulating activities. This includes painting, reading, singing, dancing, and more, offering a diverse range of experiences.

Our nursing team also arrange outings to parks and local attractions, enriching their time with varied adventures beyond the hospice walls.

We offer tailor-made therapies involving art, music, play and delightful interactions with animals too! These experiences open doors for children to discover new passions, bringing remarkable improvements to their well-being.

Bereavement support

Our bereavement suite offers a private and comfortable space in which parents can begin to come to terms with the loss of their child should this happen.

This represents the saddest side of our work but it continues to be an invaluable facility in the most difficult of circumstances.

Our staff will support families to access recommended help or counselling at this time.

Our bereavement groups also aim to bring together families who have experienced loss, offering understanding and compassion in a supportive environment. Again, your money helps us to facilitate these services.

Chloe's story

Meet Chloe, a remarkable young girl whose journey with us began 14 years ago!

Back in 2010, Chloe's early days were marked by the challenges of epilepsy and vision impairment. Yet from the very beginning, her spirit shone brightly, and she was always a determined little girl.

To commemorate our Middlesbrough hospice's 20th Anniversary, Chloe and her family were invited back to the hospice for the grand unveiling of our new play park - an event which seen them participate in a piece from BBC look North.

During their visit, Chloe's mum Kim and her dad Ben shared their heartfelt gratitude for the support they received during their daughter's time with us.

"Zoe's Place came for us at exactly the right time." said Kim.

"We were only alerted to the fact that respite services existed when Chloe was a few months old. A nurse who worked at a hospital in Newcastle made a referral to Zoe's Place for us, and we lived locally, so it was ideal."

"Despite our initial doubts, the team welcomed us with open arms, easing our worries and making us feel comfortable which allowed us to get the respite we needed."





For Chloe's family, Zoe's Place wasn't just a haven - it was a lifeline. With our expert care services and nurturing environment, they found time to relax amidst from the challenges they faced, allowing them to recharge and regroup. Chloe blossomed under the gentle guidance of our dedicated team, where she stayed for over 14 months.

Perhaps the most remarkable aspect of Chloe's journey is the upward trajectory it has set her on despite her conditions. With the care and support she received at our hospice, Chloe learnt new skills and grew as a person. Her path continues to have similar complications, but she's now an incredible teenager with a great personality.

She's also settled in mainstream education, and despite her ongoing issues, she is still as amazing as she was all those years ago. In dad Ben's eyes, Zoe's Place isn't just a local hospice - it's a family.

"We'll always remember the bonds we formed. On our recent visit it was amazing to see staff we knew from all those years ago as well. Especially Chloe's favourite nurse 'Mama Kaley'." "It wasn't just about the care they provided - it's about the love they share, the memories they create, and the hope they inspire, and we'll never forget what they did for us."

Chloe's heartwarming journey serves as a poignant reminder of the impact Zoe's Place has on people like Kim, Ben and Chloe, and given that it's our 20th Anniversary this year, we hope that we can create more memories like this for the next 20 years - and beyond!
