Service provision

We can accommodate up to six babies or children at any one time. Our facilities are available for the whole family if needed.

The main aim is to provide specialist nursing care for each child whilst simultaneously providing much needed respite for parents and carers.

A referral to Zoe's Place can be made by a family member or a health care professional involved in the care of the child.

Activities and therapies

At Zoe's Place, we focus on engaging children in a spectrum of stimulating activities. This includes painting, reading, singing, dancing, and more, offering a diverse range of experiences.

Our nursing team also arrange outings to parks and local attractions, enriching their time with varied adventures beyond the hospice walls.

We offer tailor-made therapies involving art, music, play and delightful interactions with animals too! These experiences open doors for children to discover new passions, bringing remarkable improvements to their well-being.

These moments are treasured by the children so by donating, you make a significant contribution to their happiness at Zoe's Place.



Philosophy of care

We are a registered charity and our care is completely free of charge to all families using our services - all thanks to your donations!

Babies and children come to Zoe's Place to live life to the fullest - and we do everything we can to support each child's needs.

Bereavement support

Our bereavement suite offers a private and comfortable space in which parents can begin to come to terms with the loss of their child - should this happen.

Our bereavement groups also aim to bring together families who have experienced loss, offering understanding and compassion in a supportive environment.

Sienna's story

Imagine being told your 6-month-old baby has just another 18 months to live.

That's the unimaginable reality parents like Sienna's face. Diagnosed with spinal muscular atrophy, her journey seemed complicated at first, but with courage and a special treatment, Sienna defied the odds, approaching her second birthday with a newfound strength.

In the face of such a difficult prognosis, Sienna's family made a courageous decision. They chose to try a trial treatment - offered by clinical specialists to infants with the most severe cases of muscular atrophy.

It was a massive risk, but their bravery prevailed, and initial tests proved successful, so they moved forward with hope. However, mum and dad were still looking for a little help, so they decided to chat about the possibilities of respite, to give them a little break from Sienna's constant care.

Further conversations with doctors alerted them to our hospice, and even though they were hesitant at first, they decided to pay us a visit.

"We knew we had to give Sienna every chance," her mum, Sian, recalls.

"We needed a little rest because caring for her around the clock was becoming tiring. However, we had to make sure any additional help was right for us, and her."

It wasn't long before Zoe's Place provided a sanctuary for Sienna. With the help of our dedicated nurse-led team, she explored sensory activities and enjoyed a world of creativity, some of which she didn't have access to at home.

To have the respite support we offer made a huge difference. It gave her parents time to spend with each other - knowing Sienna was being well looked after.

"We can now safely say that Zoe's has been a lifeline for us. It's where Sienna can truly be herself and thrive. My initial doubts about leaving her were helped by chatting to their amazing team, who have been so kind." Sian added.

The family's unwavering love has been hugely significant, propelling them through every challenge. "Sienna is our little warrior, and we'll do whatever it takes to support her. However, it's always nice knowing that we have the support too." Sian said.

Having recently celebrated her 3rd birthday, Sienna's future looks a little different. Complications can still arise from time to time, but the care and attention provided here has become a cornerstone of her growth, where she doesn't just survive, she thrives.

Sienna's journey, once uncertain, now stands as a testament to resilience and hope.
